Spotlight Sessions – Crafting and Shooting an Interview

Festival Filmmaker Interns

Festival Film and Production Interns hone their storytelling skills in front of and behind the camera as they prepare for, execute, shoot, and edit a series of interviews with visiting filmmakers and industry guests. This year's intern cohort comes from partner institutions, the Isaacson School for Communication, Arts and Media at Colorado Mountain College, and the Aurora Community College Cinematic Arts Department.

Young Filmmaker Lab: Creative Storytelling through Sound

April 3 @ CMC Spring Valley Campus New Space Theater, Glenwood Springs By invitation

Colorado Mountain College students from the Isaacson School for Communication, Arts and Media, festival interns, and visiting high school film students participate in a Young Filmmaker Lab that focuses on the role of sound design in filmmaking. George Lucas said that sound is 50% of the movie experience, but most young filmmakers don't have a deep understanding of how to use the art of sound design to give their stories impact and connect with audiences. In this presentation, Dolby Creator Lab Director, Glenn Kiser, shares examples of great sound design in movies, provides a practical breakdown of the components of film sound, and talks with one of Aspen Shortsfest's visiting film directors.

GLENN KISER BIO

Glenn Kiser is the Director of Dolby Creator Lab, Dolby's initiative to educate and inspire emerging filmmakers and artists about the creative use of sound and image in storytelling. He is the host of the Dolby Creator Talks podcast, which features in-depth conversations with artists working in film, episodic, music, gaming, and podcasting. He established the Dolby Creator Lab Grant, supporting exciting new films from directors including Sean Wang, the Daniels, Rebecca Hall, Alma Har'el, and Taika Waititi. Previously, Kiser ran Lucasfilm's Skywalker Sound, where he oversaw sound teams on numerous films including Avatar, The Incredibles, Wall-E, and the Star Wars prequels. Before joining Skywalker, Kiser was a post-production executive at Propaganda Films, where he worked with directors including David Fincher, Spike Jonze, and Jane Campion.
